Bring print APA style manual into class. Distribute handouts (Psych Research Guide & page 1 of Booty Call article) at each station. Get textbook from reserve or borrow a student's.

- Sample APA student paper (either from Research & Doc or APA Basics)

- a Word doc with the DOI and article name for pasting, my name, email

Library Cards, barcodes = database and online collections access.

Tell people to pick up applications on the way out (put them by door).

For this research paper, you are going to be working with academic or scholarly articles.

- they are the result of original research
- have been reviewed by a panel of other experts (or peers) in the field. This is why they are sometimes called peer-reviewed articles.

An academic article looks like this (show booty call article)

- author, affiliation, and journal name and other citation information clearly indicated,
- abstract, method section, discussion, conclusion,
- list of references the authors used
- this is what an academic paper looks like when it's published in a print journal
- You research paper is going to look like this (show sample student paper and point out title page, abstract, citations in text, list of references).

Citations

- Each citation in the list of references corresponds to a citation in-text, or in the body of the paper.
- Formatted according to APA style, which stands for American Psychological Association.
- mention other styles for other fields

The authors of your textbook have used lots of these kinds of articles in writing the book, as you can see in the references section in the back of your book. [Show the section.] This is one starting point for finding articles (the instructor encourages them to use this).

Let's talk about how you go about finding some of these academic articles.

- Lots of academic articles online, but often they are not free
- CSM students have free access to thousands of articles in the library databases

- define what Databases are
- point out suggested dbases on handout and show the dbase list in the Psych libguide

### **Exercise using Periodical finder:**

Everyone go to the library home page and go to Articles & Databases.

- main way to access our subscription databases
- at home, you'll be prompted to enter your library card
- when searching for a specific article -- use the information in the citation
- click on Periodicals and type in Journal of Sex Research
- notice that different databases have different years of coverage
- select Academic Search Premier (explain that this is not yet on dbase alpha list)

Now, if you're searching for multiple articles on a topic, then you go into the databases and search by keyword.

- Have everyone go back to Articles & Databases Page
- Have everyone go into Proquest Psychology Collection
- search under "adolescent emotions" or whatever topic they are interested in
- point out subject terms, abstract for deciding relevance, email and citation tools
- disclaimer about citation quality of citations that dbases generate
- segue into NoodleBib introduction

### **Demo**

Control pcs to show NoodleBib. Tell laptop users to watch the screen or someone's desktop.

- open Booty Call article in one window and NoodleBib in another window and tile them both on the screen
- walk through creating the citation in APA style using the elements from the article - refer students to their handout of the first page of this article
- demo exporting to Word; say how they can export to their Google Docs in mysmccd

### **Exercise: Creating NB account**

Have everyone create their own account in NB.

If there's no time to create NB accounts, tell everyone the NoodleBib Off campus logins: csmlibrary, csmnoodle and that they'll enter those first and then create their own username and password.

Remind people to pick up applications on the way out and to get library cards soon.
